This is a small surgical procedure performed as part of the Ponseti method after the weekly casts The tendon at the back of the heel is surgically cut to bring the ankle up Why is it done? To lengthen the Achilles tendon (heel tendon) - allowing the ankle to flex up This allows the heel to be placed flat on the

Achilles tenotomy is a recognised step in the Ponseti technique for the correction of idiopathic congenital talipes equinovarus in most percutaneous cases Its use has been limited in part by concern that the subsequent natural history of the tendon is unknown In
