Pronunciation of final "-ed" Simple Past Tense The final -ed ending has three different pronunciations: /t/, /d/, and /ed/ Final - ed is pronounced after /t/ all voiceless sounds Voiceless sounds are made by pushing air through your mouth; no sound comes from your throat
