Why did Edward conquest

Edward began interfering in Scottish affairs, demanding the Scottish king appeared before the English Parliament The final straw for John Baliol was when Edward demanded Scottish nobles send men to help him fight the French The Scots, in protest, attacked Carlisle in 1296 Edward swiftly and brutally responded, crushing his Scottish opponents
